

July 3 – Gene Pape reports - This seemed like a good answer for what to fly on the 4th of July. I finished getting it ready this morning.





This is about my remote-controlled self launcher. I have been intending to build a self - launcher that would work for all kinds of hand-launched control-line models for many years.

Gene Pape's Dogfighter leaps away from his electric launcher, which employs automotive power door lock mechanisms. This is Gene's first prototype; See flying lines for construction details that describe the second, even better, launcher..

My second prototype uses a 3-cell LiPo battery which is more compact. Where the first one was built to clamp to the heavy-duty Keter table, this one is screwed to a collapsible sawhorse. It requires the extra weight of my heavy toolbox to hold it down.
