Last Club Meeting

Our last meeting was on November 15th.

Club Flying

Saturday November 14 – Mike Massey and Jim Corbett flew, Clear sky until noon, low wind and cold.

Saturday November 21 – John Thompson Reports - Wind made flying in Eugene difficult last weekend, though we did have a good group out at the airport on Saturday and Gene, Jim and Mike Denlis were brave enough to put in a few flights while the rest of us watched.

Saturday November 28 – John Thompson Reports - Saturday was a perfect day at the Eugene flying field. Mile temperature, almost no wind. Several fliers including our far-flung member from California, Bill Badstubner. Mike Denlis, Mike Massey and I also got lots of flying in and there were a few spectators, too. I had to leave early but the flying was still going on when I left. Mike Massey was back out on Sunday, flew for about 2 and a half hours, cold but no wind, and met an RC flier interested in CL. We get a lot of really nice, calm flying days here in winter.

Saturday November 29 – Mike Massey Reports - Weather was cold. I got there at 11 and it was pretty cold. By 11:30, the cold seemed to dissipate to some degree, not warm by any stretch, but warmer. Wind was 0 until about 1:30 but still not over a few MPH.
