NCS Spring Postal Contest 2023

The Navy Carrier Society is offering a Navy Carrier Postal Contest for four weeks and five weekends starting the last weekend of April and running through Memorial Day (29 April through 29 May 2023). The contest will not be sanctioned, though any local activities can certainly be sanctioned, such as the Northwest Regionals. We've scheduled the Postal Contest window to include the first Carrier contest of the summer season and to allow some time for tuning up our equipment and trying our new models before the heavy flying season of the summer. We are hoping it is late enough to have a likelihood of reasonable weather wherever you're flying – warm enough to have melted the snow and late enough to have avoided spring winds.

To make things as easy as possible for local flying fields and small groups, you can use a painted or otherwise marked carrier deck (as allowed in the rules), and without a sanction, you can use as many (up to ten) or as few arresting lines as you have or are willing to risk a bolter with. You can also lend a model to another potential Carrier modeler, teach them how to fly and have them fly for score. Share the fun! With a painted outline at your local flying field, your local club members might be encouraged to practice more often or even sanction a local contest in the future. Here are the details:

Navy Carrier Society is the sponsor. All official and unofficial events are included. There are no prizes and no entry fees, but NCS will issue certificates electronically to the winners. What you get is bragging rights and a Top Twenty listing – plus the opportunity to participate in a contest this spring. Fly as often as you like.


The intent of the Postal is to encourage as much Carrier flying as possible, using the published rules for each event. The exceptions that I listed above (number of arresting lines required and allowing multiple contestants to use the same model) should encourage participation and make it easier to fly without hauling a full carrier deck to the flying field. We intend that each day will be treated separately. Each day would have up to three attempts for two official flights, but a contestant could fly on multiple days to hope for better weather, to fly repaired models on later days if one is damaged on one day, or just to work for a better score through practice. As it's the beginning of the season, practice/testing/training flights are encouraged.

New Models for 2023

I've received photos from Bob Heywood of his new Skyshark models. What are your plans for a new model or two this year? Send us information and a photo as things progress so we can see what's happening in your workshop.

"Skyshark" Profiles by Bob Heywood

Bob has a couple of Skysharks in the works for the coming flying season. Both are based on the Sterling Skyshark kit. The first will be flown in the .15 Carrier event. It is built from the kit with power to be provided by an OPS .15 fitted with a Supertigre ST35 carb. The covering is SIG Koverall applied with Stix-it heat-activated adhesive. Bob likes the ease of application of this method.



Bob's second Skyshark is a reprise of his 1971 NATS Profile Carrier entry which he flew with the assistance of Wayne Buran. It is basically a standard Skyshark with the fixed flap area enlarged to 100 square inches to meet the minimum wing area requirements of the Profile Carrier event. In 1971, it was powered by a McCoy Redhead 35. Fifty-two years later the power will come from a Supertigre G21/35. Bob expects the high speed to be significantly improved!

I encourage you to enter so we can get a good feel for the number of contestants and flights we should plan for – both official events and unofficial events.

So far, we have three contestants registered with 16 event entries but a total of 11 have expressed interest in flying in a total of 48 individual event entries.

The flying weather was great in Tucson last month for the Southwest Regionals. There were six contestants with lots of flights over two days of competition. The results are listed in the Top 20, as this is the only contest of the year, so far. Two new Profile records were set. Burt upped his record score in Profile with his Bf 109, and Pete Mazur increased his Electric Profile record using his MO-1.

The photo at the left shows Lou Wolgast celebrating a great flight with his Profile Guardian. It's a beautiful model, and Lou has been steadily improving his scores with it. He also had an Avenger profile model, and he flew one in Profile and one in Class I. His .15 Carrier model is a Curtis Seamew.

Mike Hatfield had a fleet of models at Tucson. Below left is his Blackburn Firebrand Class II. His Class I is a Douglas AD Skyraider (below right) as he and Burt Brokaw prepare for a flight.

Rules Change Cycle Has CLNC Proposals for 2024

The period for submitting rules change proposals for effectiveness in January 2024 has ended. There are two proposals being considered for the CL Navy Carrier events. Both are focused on reducing the effect of variation in judging low speed flight and making a greater variety of models competitive to offer contestants more choices in how they choose to design for and fly the event. It seems likely that no more than one of these proposals, if any, will be approved, but there will be active discussion of their merits and alternatives during the next five months. The CLNCCB is encouraging our contestants to take an active part in the discussions by offering their opinions through e-mail to me (tailhooker@comcast.net). I will forward your comments to the members of the CLNCCB for consideration. This is your chance to participate in the process.

- Northwest Rules will be used for these events: NW Sport Race, NW Super Sport Race, Flying Clown Race, Sportsman Clown Race, .15 Carrier, Sport 40 Carrier, 80-mph Combat, Profile Stunt, Northwest Sport Jet Speed, C Speed, F2D Proto Speed and Northwest B Proto Speed. - PRECISION AEROBATICS: ARF planes allowed, zero appearance points. ARC appearance up to 10 points. Precision Aerobatics Model Pilots Association rules will be used for Old-Time Stunt and Classic/Nostalgia 30 Stunt.
- COMBAT: All events double-elimination. LINE-TENSION FLYAWAY SHUTOFFS required in all events: Failure of a shutoff results in disqualification from the event. No electric planes allowed.
- SCALE: Make sure your airplane has been flight tested and is ready for competition, per AMA rules.
- · Safety thongs required in all events.

OTHER INFORMATION

- AMA membership required for all participants. AMA membership available at registration.
- Only participants and officials allowed in flying areas. All others must stay outside roped-off or restricted areas.
- Absolutely no alcoholic beverages on flying field during meet hours.
- Awards Through third place in each event. Grand championship trophies!
- Product vendors contact contest director for permission and site info.
- Camping: Free RV parking (no hookups) available on site; space is limited. No tent camping allowed.
- · Parking: In airport parking lot and across the street on weekend. NO PARKING in real estate office lot.
