2024 VSC Championships at Christopher Columbus Park in Full Swing

The Vintage Stunt Championships (VSC) XXXV were held on March 13th to 16th at the Christopher Columbus Park in Tucson, Arizona. It was great that this year's attendance was on the upswing. The post-Covid era has taken a while for events like these to gain momentum when it comes to attendance. We can only hope that the attendance will continue to improve in the years to come.

For those who have never attend VSC, you really need to put this event on your bucket list. The control line aerobatic community is a small, diverse, and I might add, elderly group of modelers, from all walks of life, who enjoy control-line model aviation. Yet it's like a large close knit family. Individuals from all over the US make the self-sacrificing venture to be at this unique event that really is a showcase of aerobatic control-line aviation of yesteryear. Folks arrived as early as Friday, March 8 to practice and enjoy the Tucson weather

Wednesday March 13 – Old Time Stunt (OTS):

Wednesday started with a morning pilots meeting which outlined the contest timeline and some of the nuances in the rules. There was a somber moment following the pilots meeting when Jim Hoffman read a list of names of those we lost in the past year that are no longer with us.

The first event flown celebrated the era of OTS which are models that must have been designed, published or kitted prior to December 31, 1952. That means these planes were designed, published or kitted at least 72 years ago!

This year started with 17 entries for OTS, but only 14 flew official flights. These entries were divided and placed into two groups that would have the opportunity to fly a total of four rounds flown all in one day. Group 1 flew their first flight on Circle 1, second flight on Circle 2. Third flight back on Circle 2. The fourth and final flight on Circle 1. The individual's final score is based on adding together the flyers best score on Circle 1 and the best score on Circle 2. Group 2 flew on the opposite circles.

The day started off with calm winds but gradually increased as the day went on. Each circle had a different set of judges. Judges on Circle 1 were Larry Lindburg and Mark Gerber. On Circle 2 were Mark Smith and Gary Akers.

When the dust finally settled, first place went to Joe Gilbert with a score of 589.5. Joe was flying a Ringmaster powered with a Brodak 25. Second place went to Lou Wolgast flying his Humongous, posting a score of 577. Third place went to Dennis Adamisin with a score of 570. Dennis flew an electric powered All American using an Arrowind 2815 motor on Spectra lines.

Thursday, March 14 – Classic (Day 1) and Ignition Old Time Stunt:

To fly in the Classic event requires that the model be published, designed, or kitted prior to the year 1970. This means that these models could be a little "younger" than those flown in OTS and are 54 years old or older. A model that meets the OTS requirements could also be flown in Classic, if one chose to do so.

As previously mentioned, Appearance Judging took place on Wednesday afternoon for both Classic and Super 70's events.

Again the day started off with ideal weather with very little wind in the morning, gradually increased in the afternoon. There were 25 entries in this event this year, but only 20 chose to post a score. Similar to OTS, each competitor would fly a total of four rounds, but would fly two flights on Thursday and two flights on Friday. Judges for this event were Randy Powell and Pete Peterson on Circle 1. On Circle 2 were Warren Tiahrt and David Fitzgerald. David flew into Tucson just to judge this event. This event moved quite rapidly with all the flying completed for each day.

On Day 1, Dennis Adamisin, Paul Walker, Joe Gilbert and Jim Hoffman appeared to be in good shape heading into Day 2.
