Profile Cardinal – Gary Weems

The Profile Cardinal is from a kit. I worked on it sporadically since around Thanksgiving. Well, a year ago last Thanksgiving. Kit balsa was very marginal to unacceptable. The fuselage would have made a great 39 X 3.5 prop. I routed grooves into it, twisted it flat and inserted a square carbon fiber rod as a spine to hold it in shape.

One of the flaps weighed exactly 1oz more than the other. Leading edge sheeting was cut to shape and short which I discovered after the wing frame was assembled. Wing tip balsa was short for the largest pieces.



All sobbing aside it turned out pretty good, a bit heavy at 53oz which is normal for me. It is being powered by OS LA 46. I built the main control horn to be adjustable and replaced the wire landing gear with formed aluminum. The nose is a bit goofy because I used one of several Tru-Turn spinners I got from a sell out at Central Hobbies. They are a size smaller than kit specified. Wing tip flaps are adjustable using aluminum hinges and I built the weight box to my specifications. All balsa was covered with carbon veil. The wing is covered with Poly-Span and all finish is Randolph dope.

Fox Rocket – Gene Pape

This is what I spent a lot of my modeling time doing last week including yesterday after the club meeting.

The engine on the left in the far finished photos is a mostly correct '62 Fox Rocket 35, the middle engine is a '62 Fox Rocket 35 case with mostly '57 Fox Combat Special parts including the black head that should not be black.



The engine on the right is a '58 Fox Black Head Combat Special. It's the only one of the 3 that's got all the correct parts.
