the wing is from the '75 Regionals, the first year I was contest director of that event.

As this was intended as a sport model it has a K&B 40 rather than the usual Fox 36X I would have used for competition. I had completely forgotten it. It seems it somehow came into the possession of one of the first Prop Spinners members I met, Dave Childs. He has owned it for a very long time and kept it in the condition you see it in.

Much to my surprise, he came up to me after the Bladder Grabber a few weeks ago, introduced himself, and presented me with the airplane. It's been a long time since I had seen Dave and the years had changed him so I didn't recognize him right off. The model hadn't changed a bit so I recognized it right off. It's too bad we don't last as well as some of our things do.

The bottom line however is that It was a much greater pleasure seeing Dave again than getting this Voodoo back. He is in good health now and I hope to have more chances to get together with him in the future.
