#### NORTHWEST FLYING CLOWN RACE

1) THIS EVENT IS INTENDED FOR ALL FLYERS AND PITMEN INTERESTED IN A SIMPLE, "LAID-BACK" RACING EVENT WHICH USES A COMMON AIRCRAFT, EMPHASIZES BOTH SPEED AND ECONOMY, AND ENCOURAGES THE USE OF A WIDE VARIETY OF ENGINES.

2) ALL PERTINENT AMA RULES FROM THE AMA CONTROL-LINE RACING UNIFIED RULES APPLY, EXCEPT AS FOLLOWS.

2.1) PULL TEST IS 25 POUNDS. LINES ARE .015 STRANDED STEEL. LENGTH IS 52 FEET, PLUS OR MINUS 6 INCHES, MEASURED FROM THE CENTER OF THE HANDLE TO THE FUSELAGE.

3) ENGINE: ANY DESIGN OR MAKE OF PISTON ENGINE IS ALLOWED, EXCEPT THAT MAXIMUM ENGINE DISPLACEMENT IS LIMITED TO .19 CUBIC INCHES. MODIFICATIONS ARE NOT RESTRICTED WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE AMA SAFETY CODE.

4) FUEL TANK: ANY DESIGN OF FUEL TANK IS ALLOWED, INCLUDING PRESSURE SYSTEMS, EXCEPT THAT FUEL CAPACITY IS RESTRICTED TO 1 OUNCE. THE FUEL TANK SHALL BE FULLY EXTERNAL OF THE PLANE, ON THE OUTBOARD SIDE OF THE BODY, AND ALL IN FRONT OF THE LEADING EDGE.

5) FUEL: FUEL USED SHALL CONTAIN A MAXIMUM OF 10% NITROMETHANE WITH 20% LUBRICANT AND THE REST METHANOL. FUEL MAY BE OBTAINED FROM CONTEST MANAGEMENT. DIESEL ENGINES MAY USE DIESEL FUEL.

6) AIRCRAFT: THE ONLY AIRCRAFT ALLOWED IS THE *PDQ FLYING CLOWN* OR FAITHFUL REPLICA. CHANGES TO THE PLANFORM, PROFILE, OR WING THICKNESS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED. WHEELS MUST BE AT LEAST 1 INCH IN DIAMETER, AND BE SPACED LATERALLY ABOUT 7 INCHES.

7) NO HOT GLOVES, FAST FILL, OR "TRICK" PITTING EQUIPMENT IS ALLOWED.

8) RACES: ALL PRELIMINARY HEATS AND THE FINAL RACE WILL BE TIMED FOR 15 MINUTES FROM START TO FINISH. THE CONTESTANT WITH THE MOST LAPS WINS.





- \* NW Sport Race: Stock Fox .35 stunt, stock profile kits or accurate copy of kits, 1-wheel (2") landing gear OK, no shutoff, no fastfill, suction feed, no hot glove. NW Super Sport Race: Single-bypass front-intake .40 with .315" venturi, AMA Slow Rat plane specs with outboard suction tank. Lines for both events are .018x60 braided. NW Goodyear: Restricted to specific engines. Write contest director for full rules.
- \* COMBAT \_\_ All events flown double-elimination. <u>AMA COMBAT FLYAWAY SHUTOFFS</u> <u>REOUIRED...Shutoffs subject to ground test: any flyaway in which shutoff fails to work will result in</u> <u>disqualification</u>, 80-mph Combat — Any plane/fuel system, two planes max per contestant, .018"x60' lines, AMA fast scoring.
- \* Old-Time Stunt, Classic Stunt, .15 carrier \_ Write contest director for rules.
- \* All events over asphalt except Combat, Balloon Bust, carrier, beginner-intermediate stunt and Old-Time Stunt.
- \* Navy carrier Mufflers mandatory in .15 class, optional in Profile/I/II. No tuned pipes, Magic mufflers OK.
- \* Safety thongs required in all events.

#### **OTHER INFORMATION**

- \* AMA or MAAC membership required for all participants, including mechanics. AMA membership available at registration.
- \* Only participants and officials allowed in flying areas. Others must stay outside roped-off or restricted areas.
- \* Absolutely no alcoholic beverages on flying field during meet hours.

# "Let's fly more in '94"

I don't know if there's any official modeling agency in charge of this matter, so I'll just declare it: The flying season is here.

I just returned from the flying field. It was 75 degrees in bright sunshine, with a light breeze blowing steadily in one direction: the same direction as the wind sock, for a change!! (You have to see it to believe it: Often at the Prop Spinners' field in Eugene, the wind on the north stunt circle is blowing 180 degrees the opposite way from the windsock alongside the racing circle 25 yards to the south!)

There were, at one time, 10 paid-up Prop Spinners on the field, along with assorted guests, visitors, spectators and hangers-on. Multiple planes in the air, and at least two dozen spread (not counting my stack of combat planes) out on the ground. Now that's what they mean by "Sunday flying."

And to top it off, the new stunter flies great! I've totally run out of excuses. Now I have two stunt planes to practice with (gonna fly low now!). Last weekend I limbered up one of the combat engines and hit the needle setting on the nose the first flight. All the signs point to a great year for control-line modeling in the Pacific Northwest!

The contest schedule has had its ups and downs but is getting dialed in. The Regionals were off for a while, but now they're back on, possibly bigger than ever. The Bladder Grabber is, at this writing, off. Due to field problems in Portland — city government there has become very bizarre — the GX contest is off. But everything else appears to be go: Multifarious activities in Richland, Stuntathon and the Roundup in Seattle, the Fall Follies, lots of activity in B.C. See the contest schedule in this issue. Here's a slogan: "Let's fly more in '94."

Now I have to set the record straight on a remark made in a previous column. I said that allowing .40 size engines in the new provisional 80mph combat rules, to be used at this year's Regionals, was the suggestion of Rich McConnell. Well, it wasn't. It was his idea, sort of, but not a suggestion!

Rich asked if .40 engines would be allowed, which caused me to consider the question for the first time. The first draft of the rules made no reference to engine size. Rich's question made me ponder the pros and cons of larger displacements as I polished the final draft of the rules. I decided that, since there is a speed limit, the .40 displacement should have no advantage over any smaller size; however, I felt that it should be limited to .40 so that we don't encounter someone running .60 or larger engines, resulting in huge, heavy, possibly dangerous airplanes. I figured that allowing .40 engines would open the event to more engines, which usually is considered advantageous. Several people remarked after the rules were published that they were glad to see the .40s allowed.

The point, however, is that Rich McConnell did not suggest the .40s, and in fact is generally in principle opposed to the use of .40 engines in combat. He asked that this be made clear. There may be others opposed to .40s as well. I've opposed going up in size for fast combat, for example.

The 80mph rules are experimental, and can be adjusted after we get some experience. Another flier questioned the two-plane limit. He suggested three. Maybe there should be no limit. (The idea of the limit is to discourage the kind of flying that leads to collisions, etc., without removing the kill, which shortens matches and potentially saves airplanes.)

I'd like to hear feedback on the rules as written, particularly after we've used them at a contest. We can adjust as needed. If there's a disparity of opinion, we'll run them through the *FL* rules voting procedure and settle on a permanent set.

Also, see elsewhere in this issue the rules for Northwest Flying Clown Race, as provided by Paul Rice. These were not included in our recent rules package.
