Terry Herron 1954-2025

I am sad to report that we lost one of our own last month with the death of Terry Herron of Paola, Kansas. I first got to know Terry in the 1970s in northern Illinois when we competed against one another when he was active in competition both locally and at the NATS with a very fast Japanese Judy in Class II and an equally impressive Profile. Though he was inactive in Carrier flying for a time while earning a living, starting a family, and developing his outdoor sports business, he came back to Carrier a few years ago. Last year, these pages detailed the resurrection of the third rendition of the Class II Judy with the original homemade engine which he flew last summer in Dallas. True to his prior performance, he landed the top spot in Class II Nostalgia in the 2024 Top Twenty standings. He was getting back into competition flying with Melvin Schuette and enthusiastically making plans to fly in Saint Louis next month and in the NATS in July. I enjoyed corresponding with him as we renewed our friendship and followed his Judy construction. I regret that I missed the opportunity to fly with him again.

<u>NCS Spring Postal Contest</u> <u>3 May – 1 June</u>

In 2020 NCS started the **NCS Postal Contest** tradition because of COVID. The threat of COVID has significantly diminished with outdoor events having been shown to be very low risk, and the restrictions have gone away, but the event has become a popular way to get together to fly Navy Carrier and to post a score in the NCS Top Twenty listing. The contest will not be sanctioned, though any local activities can certainly be sanctioned, such as the NW Regionals.

To make things as easy as possible for local flying fields and small groups, you can use a painted or otherwise marked carrier deck (as allowed in the rules), and without a sanction, you can use as many (up to ten) or as few arresting lines as you have or are willing to risk a bolter with. You can also lend a model to another potential Carrier modeler, teach them how to fly Carrier and have them fly for score. Share the fun! With a painted outline at your local flying field, your local club members might be encouraged to practice more often or even sanction a local contest in the future. Here are the details:

Navy Carrier Society is the sponsor. All official and unofficial events are included. There are no prizes and no entry fees. What you get is bragging rights and a Top Twenty listing – plus the opportunity to participate in a contest this spring. Fly as often as you like – each day is a new opportunity for making three attempts.

All AMA rules apply, except for the requirement for a full set of arresting lines and the ability to share models.

The only requirement for entry is that each entry be accompanied by an electronic photograph of the activity – models, contestants, etc., even the pizza party after flying – plus a brief description (who, what, where). Send scores (and high, low, landing scores if you like) and an electronic photo to Dick Perry (<u>Tailhooker@comcast.net</u>) We'll publish the photos in periodic High-Low-Landing newsletters.

We'd like to see who is flying and what you are flying. Do you have a new model ready to go after the winter building season? Bring it out. Even better, if your new model isn't quite finished, finish it in time to enter it in the Postal Contest. We'll be looking for your entry, and we'll be looking forward to getting started filling up the Top Twenty rankings for the year.

National Model Airplane Championships 7-10 July, Muncie, Indiana Dick Perry

Please register for the NATS Carrier competition if you have plans to attend. I've heard from many of you who will be in Muncie, and a few have registered, but I encourage you to register soon so that your entry will be

counted in determining the number of awards that will be available for our events, both official and unofficial. Registration is at: <u>Nats 2025 Control Line Navy Carrier | Academy of Model Aeronautics</u>. It is not necessary to register through AMA for the unofficial events, but please let me know (<u>tailhooker@comcast.net</u>) what unofficial events you are planning to enter so that I can order the awards.

I will be the official Event Director for all Carrier events at the NATS, and I am recruiting officials to serve as Center Judge and/or Event Director for the individual events. If you are not planning to fly electric events or gas events, I would appreciate your consideration of volunteering for any event you are not flying. I would like to fly but cannot, unless I have a CD for each individual event. You will not have to do any reporting, score tabulation, timer recruiting or any of the other usual tasks, but you would earn my undying gratitude!

The NATS Navy Carrier schedule will be the same as it was the last few years with processing on Monday, 7 July, from 4:00 to 6:00 pm at the McCullough Center at the AMA Museum. Profile event (including Sportsman Profile) will be Tuesday, 8 July, with Class I and II flying on Wednesday, 9 July. The unofficial events -- Skyray (gas and electric combined), .15 Carrier (gas and electric combined), and the three classes of Nostalgia Carrier -- will be flown on Thursday, 10 July. The annual Awards Banquet will be Wednesday evening.

stunt circle.

In the early afternoon we delved into N.W. Sport .40 class planes. Flights logged by Mike Hazel, Jim McCartney, and myself, along with our enthusiastic newcomer Mike Dukes, got us all on the board. Though none of us achieved phenomenal speeds or exceptionally slow flights, the competition is always close in this class.

- New! CLASSIC/NOSTALGIA 30 STUNT: Combined with all Classic-legal planes receiving a 10-point bonus.
- COMBAT: All events double-elimination. LINE-TENSION FLYAWAY SHUTOFFS required in all events: Failure of a shutoff results in disqualification from the event. No electric planes allowed.
- SPEED: AMA .21 Proto will be combined with NASS .21 Profile Proto
- SCALE: Make sure your airplane has been flight tested and is ready for competition, per AMA rules.
- Safety thongs required in all events.

OTHER INFORMATION

- AMA membership required for all participants. AMA membership available at registration.
- Only participants and officials allowed in flying areas. All others must stay outside roped-off or restricted areas.
- Absolutely no alcoholic beverages or other intoxicants on flying field during meet hours.
- Awards Through third place in each event. Grand championship trophies!
- Product vendors contact contest director for permission and site info.
- Camping: Free RV parking (no hookups) available on site; space is limited. No tent camping allowed.
- Parking: In airport parking lot and across the street on weekend. NO PARKING in real estate office lot.
