It is with great sadness that we report the passing of Ted Kraver on June 10, 2023. He had been suffering a series of strokes over the last few years and had been in a nursing home for that period.

Ted was a lifelong modeler and particularly loved Control Line Scale and Carrier. He contributed greatly to both activities over his lifetime. In 1976 he started a newsletter for Navy Carrier enthusiasts, High Low Landings, and generated a mailing list so that the newsletter could get (at his own expense) to as many Carrier people as possible, including nearly all the active Carrier fliers at the time. At a dinner meeting during the 1977 Nats in Riverside, CA, the attendees voted to form a special interest group for Carrier whose foundation was the newsletter and mailing list that Ted had created. This special interest group became the Navy Carrier Society and you are reading the High Low Landings. Ted had

the idea for the Eugene Ely Award, made the first trophy and presented it at the same 1977 Nats. Ted served for many years as editor for High Low Landings and as Secretary-Treasurer of the Navy Carrier Society.

Ted was a very creative person in so many areas, both within model aviation and in the world of entrepreneurship and technical inventions in various mechanical fields. For the latter, there is even a book available to learn about his life: The Life Story of Theodore C. "Ted" Kraver: Eminence Grise: Kraver, Ted C, Gulliford, Ken: 9780999367520: Amazon.com: Books His creativity and boldness in model aviation was not devoted to winning events but rather to undertaking new challenges that could be really enjoyed by all. He built and flew a Curtis Pusher, a model of the one Eugene Ely flew for his pioneering Carrier flights, that had contestants and spectators cheering at the Nats. One year he brought a model of the Convair XFY Pogo, a vertical-takeoff-andlanding carrier based airplane, to the Nats. Although the model enjoyed no more success than the prototype, it was a delight to watch, Ted's favorite Carrier airplane was the Grumman F7F Tigercat twin and he built several in different sizes. In Controlline Scale, Ted also flew only unusual models; sometimes they could even be described as bizarre, but they were always fascinating. Ted wrote the C/L Scale column for Model Aviation for a while, too.

New Models for 2023 "Judy" 3.0, Terry Herron, Paola, Kansas

Terry Herron first flew his Judy in 1973. It was replaced in 1997 by Judy 2.0 which used a fiberglass fuselage but preserved the same dimensions as the original. Over the last year, Terry built Judy 3.0 around the 1997 fiberglass fuselage, using the same engine as the original version. Terry reports excellent flight characteristics on the first test flights recently completed.

The engine is a .64 cu in displacement constructed from OPS and SuperTigre components and using a forged magnesium mount. The foam wing has an MH54 airfoil. Overall weight is 12 ounces less than Judy 2.0! Terry finished the model in tissue and dope, and the weathered finish looks great!









OOPS!

Your editor erred in his late-night efforts to get out the last newsletter! I identified Paul Smith's model as a Fairey Spearfish. Below are photos of Paul's model beside one by Mike Anderson. Even in Profile models one can see the differences. The real Spearfish is on the right, the real Barracuda is on the left. The drawing below is the prototype Barracuda with the lower horizontal tail. The production Barracuda had the tail mounted about ³/₄ of the way up the vertical stabilizer. This engineer's guess is that the low position encountered heavy buffeting, and possible loss of control effectiveness when the large Youngman flaps were deployed for dive bombing. The Spearfish had a lower wing, since it didn't have observer's windows below the wing, so the horizontal stab at the base of the vertical stabilizer likely wasn't exposed to as much turbulence during dive bombing. The Spearfish was the follow-on Fairey offering to the Barracuda. It was bigger, more powerful, one less crewmember, twice the weapons load, and had in internal weapons bay for the torpedo.
